

The Scholastic Fair

Just the Facts

- ❖ The purpose is for you to share your knowledge, hobby, talent or interest. You may choose ANY subject matter.
- ❖ Students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade are invited to enter a project.
- ❖ Projects may be done by one student OR by a team of two students. All grade levels will compete within their own grade. When students from different grades work together, their projects will compete with the highest grade level represented by the team.
- ❖ The Scholastic Fair is Thursday, March 15, 2018. All projects must be completed and set up in the Fenner gym by 8:00 a.m. You may set up your project early on Wednesday, March 14th between 3:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. in the Fenner gym. A project can be brought to school earlier if it can be stored in your classroom, but please ask your teacher for permission.
- ❖ Projects should be no larger than 3ft. by 3ft. On your registration form, please indicate any special requests you may have such as an electrical outlet, a round table (for a 360° project), a larger display area, etc...
- ❖ Although a project board is not needed, they can be purchased at Pencil Place, Wal-Mart, and Office Max
- ❖ All projects will be judged. Your teacher will excuse you for a short time on Thursday morning to speak with two judges. You will explain your project to the judges so they can learn (from you) what your project is trying to demonstrate. The judges will select the winners.
- ❖ When selecting the winning projects, the judges will consider the <u>content</u>, <u>originality</u>, <u>attractiveness</u>, <u>and student knowledge of the subject matter</u>.

- ❖ All participants will receive a certificate and a small prize for completing a project.
- ❖ Prizes will be awarded at each grade level (3rd-5th), along with a Principal's Choice Award. The Awards Ceremony will take place at 6:30 p.m. on March 15th in the Fenner Gym. Please come early to view all of the exhibits. (People usually filter in around 6:00 p.m.). Please encourage your family and friends to come see what Fenner students can do!
- ❖ Projects should be taken home after the Awards Ceremony.

- ☐ You should have your **FIRST and LAST NAME and GRADE** displayed on your project.
- ☐ Your project should have a **TITLE**.
- Make sure there is a sign, poster, or other written explanation explaining your project.
- ☐ Live animals are prohibited.
- ☐ Proper attention to safety is expected.
- You can explain your project to the judges and answer their questions.
