2020-2021 Proposed Budget

The 2020/21 Budget will provide the necessary resources for our students to attain the knowledge required to meet the standards necessary to reach higher education and work goals. The passage of the New York State budget inclusive of additional State Aid should allow the District to levy a tax equal to the tax levied in the preceding year.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPONENT

The administrative component of the budget incorporates the fiscal and business operations of the District along with the direct and indirect supervision of the professional and non-professional staff.

The District ended the 19/20 year with great uncertainty due to the COVID-19 constraints placed on all areas of the community and country. The District was able to provide 1:1 devices to all of its students to facilitate distance learning activities provided by the teaching staff. State support for public schools will be assessed quarterly and revised according to the State's fiscal instability.

The program component of the budget represents the cost of providing an appropriate education to all of the students of the District.

The athletic complex opened this past Fall and construction is in full swing for the secure entryways, Fenner nursing suite and Temple Offices. Flooring in the MHS media and fitness center were completed in 2019/20, with upgrades to some of the MHS cameras to be completed this Spring with 19/20 Capital Outlay funds. We are currently developing the scope of the 2020/21 capital outlay project.

Chautauqua County School District's Medical Health Plan is a self-insured consortium of districts throughout the County that leverages its member numbers to maintain insurance rates at a level below community rates. Our experience allowed us to keep rates within 2% of last year's rates.

CAPITAL COMPONENT

The Capital and Undistributed components of the budget are for the operations and maintenance of the facilities, repayment of existing debt and appropriations that are general in nature and attributable to the other components in part.




